In 2023, we continued our mission to provide holistic, work-integrated, hands-on experiential learning experiences for Black Youth in STEMM, supporting our largest cohort of students since inception. We welcomed one-of-a-kind projects from new and returning internship hosts and connected with new community partners, cementing ourselves as an innovative, community focused, and sustainable program.

This report captures the highlights of another memorable year of operation for the ELITE Program for Black Youth.



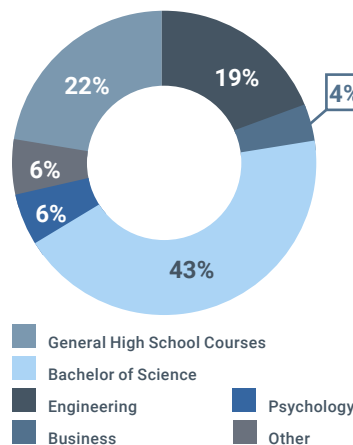

ELITE Program 2023 Interns

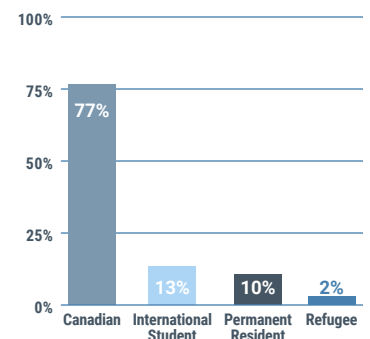
Total Number of Interns: 53

In 2023, the ELITE Program supported a large and diverse cohort of students. Most notably, this group featured our largest contingent of Francophone students to date. Approximately one-third of the cohort was composed of returning interns. Additionally, for a second year, the ELITE Program partnered with Carleton University to host undergraduate interns from their Faculty of Engineering and Design.

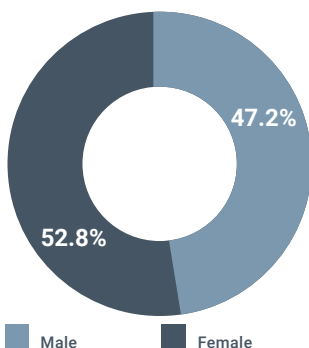
Areas of Study



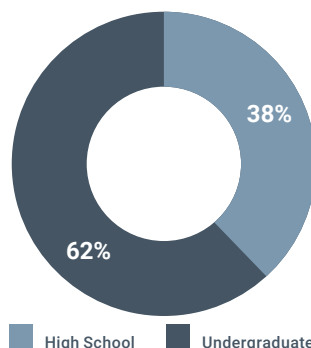
Citizenship Status



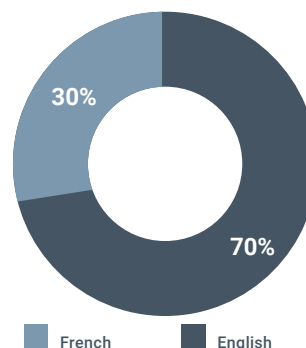
Gender



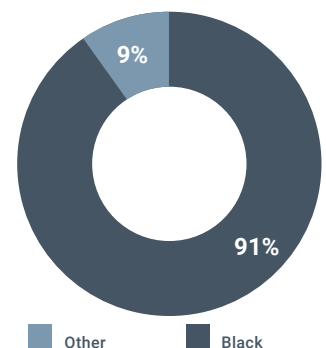
Academic Level

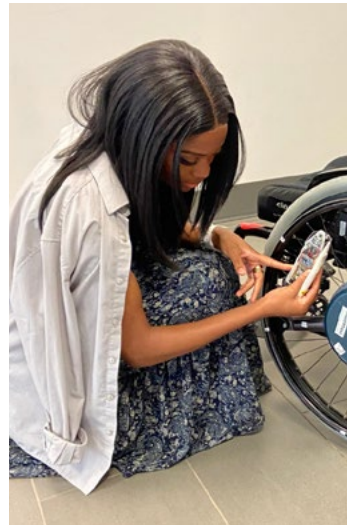

The ELITE Impact

- » From a program survey conducted by the Black Business Ventures Association, we know that for many interns, this internship was their first practical work experience.
- » Out of the participants in the Entrepreneurship Design Series, 21 reported starting new entrepreneurial or business ventures since completing the ELITE Program.
- » The Wellness and Coaching team was accepted to participate in the Canadian Counseling and Psychotherapy Association's 2023 Conference.
- » Madison Dabbs-Petty, the Wellness Coordinator for the Wellness and Coaching series, attended the Canadian Psychological Association's (CPA) 2023 Conference to present a poster based on ELITE Program research.
- » Upon completion of the Wellness and Coaching program, both high school and undergraduate interns saw significant increases in their ability to manage microaggressions and anti-Black racism, cope with stress, and identify and communicate their emotions among other wellness goals set in the program.

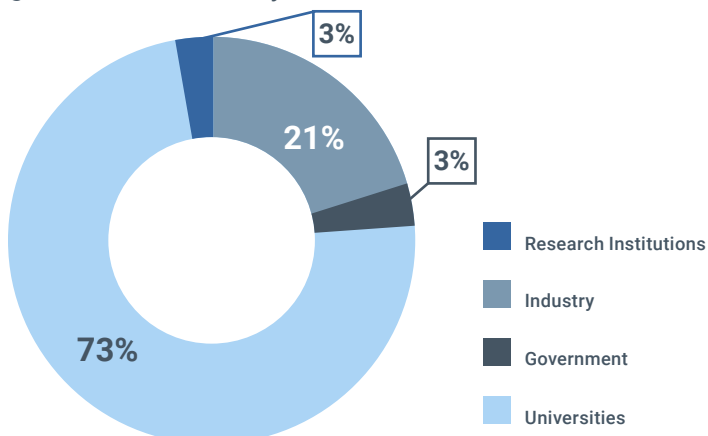

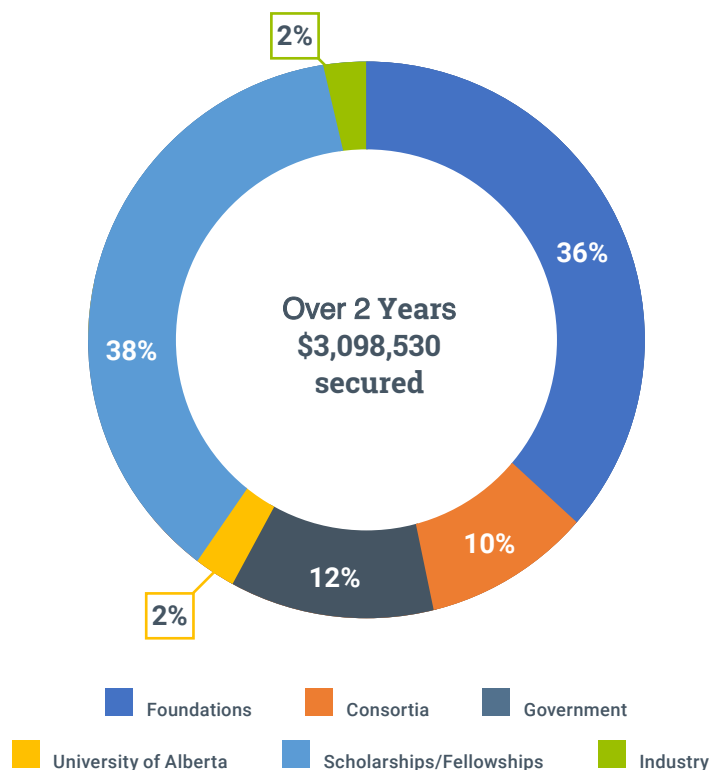

Funding

The ELITE Program for Black Youth has had generous financial support from not-for-profit organizations, foundations, industry, and government over the past three cohorts since inception in January 2021. During that period, we have received \$1,488,530 in cash contributions, and have already secured \$450,000 for the upcoming three-year cycle which begins in 2024. We also secured \$440,000 in scholarship opportunities over the past three years for high school and undergraduate students and \$720,000 for fellowships for Black graduate students in Engineering and Science at the University of Alberta.

New to the 2023 year, the Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council (NSERC) of Canada offered \$72,000 in funding to students in STEM through their [Undergraduate Student Research Awards Program](#). A total of 12 undergraduate interns from the ELITE Program received funding from the program.

Additionally, we were also grateful to receive a gift from Stantec of \$12,000 toward our program operations and secured \$5,000 in funding from the Edmonton Regional Innovation Network (ERIN) for the Entrepreneurship Design Series. We remain open to engagements around funding opportunities to support the next three years of ELITE Program work-integrated internships and training.
